The Siege of Cawnpore was a key episode in the Indian rebellion of 1857. The besieged Company forces and civilians in Cawnpore (now Kanpur) were the victims of the Satichaura Ghat massacre and the Bibighar massacre. Kanpur is the 12th most populous city in India and the second largest city in the state of Uttar Pradesh by the British as justification for unrestrained vengeance.
